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Eva Winkler is professor for translational medical ethics, director of the Institute for Medical and Data Ethics (IMDE), and vice-dean for digitalization at the Medical Faculty of Heidelberg University. She is a specialist in hematology and oncology, member of the board of directors of the National Center for Tumor Diseases (NCT) Heidelberg and works as a senior physician in the Department of Medical Oncology at the University Hospital Heidelberg (UKHD). Eva Winkler holds a doctorate in cancer research and a PhD in medical and health ethics. Her main research areas are: clinical ethics, research ethics, and public health ethics. Eva Winkler is scientific director and spokesperson of EURAT (interdisciplinary platform for Ethical and Legal Aspects of Translational Medicine) and one of the founding directors of the Camilla and Georg Jellinek Center for Ethics at Heidelberg University. As an expert, Eva Winkler is active in various committees: she is vice-chair of the German Ethics Council, chair of ZEKO – Central Ethics Commission of the German Medical Association, and vice-president of the Academy for Ethics in Medicine (AEM).
